Watergrasshill United goes from strength to strength in 2012

2012 has been a successful year for Watergrasshill United, from the 14th of January when we returned to training up until the first week of December when our U16's wrote club history by winning the National Area Cup final and progressing into the last 32 of the National Cup.

It was a year in which we saw our membership grow to over 300 members and were we were able to invest heavily in our Skehanagh Park premises with upgraded floodlights, dugouts, signage and ground works. All to facilitate our boys and girls academy players, our CSL and junior teams. Our upgraded Skehanagh facilities were made available to the wider Watergrasshill community to host the inter school tournaments and the very successful over 35 parish league won by Glenville.

Our U7 (2 teams), U8, U9 and U10 participated in the CSL Small Sided Games (SSG) leagues from the start of April to the end of May. This non competitive league is a great experience for our academy players and we saw great progress of our academy players during this 8 week period. All teams performed to a high standard and are a credit to their coaches and parents.



Our U11's secured 1st place in the noncompetitive CSL league and our Watergrasshill United U15 team completed a remarkable season by clinching the U15 CSL division 3 Title with a hard fought 2-2 draw away to reigning 3 times CSL champions Macroom. A well deserved league triumph for a team that have been together for the last 6 years and proved a triumph of perseverance, hard work, skill and determination. The team finished with a true league record of 11 wins, two draws and a goal difference of 92 scored and 17 against.

In May we organized the Fashion show together with the Watergrashill National School Parents Association and we would like to thank everyone who supported, sponsored and participated in one of our most successful community fundraising events. Another successful event was our annual presentation night during the start of June in the new Watergrasshill Arts center. Here we presented all academy players with their medals and player awards to our team players of the year.







Our summer camp, traditionally during the first week of July, was a great success again with over 140 boys and girls participating. 5 days of non competitive games, training, team sports and fun organized for community by the community.



Our Girl Academy continues to excel and this year, for the first time, our older girls are participating in the Cork Women & Schoolgirls Soccer League (C.W.S.S.L) and Futsal league. They wrote history for the club when they played their first competitive league since the formation of Watergrasshill United, back in 2004. As coaches, it's imperative we keep this great group of girls together and playing for Watergrasshill United and to date this has been down to the great weekly work of Jackie & Ber over the past few years.









Since October our academy teams are competing in the Futsal competition organized by the CSL in the Sports Village on Model Farm Road. This indoor competition will take place during the winter months and each team will play 1 game every 4 weeks. These non-competitive indoor matches are all about team work and passing, great skills that our players will need once they return to the outdoor CSL Small Sided Games (SSG) leagues in the next year.

Another highlight for the year was the selection of our Watergrasshill United U12 Player Sean Desmond for the Cork Development Squad. A great honor for both Sean and for the club and it is well deserved opportunity for him to further develop his footballing abilities. Sean is a tremendously skillful player and has been our man of the match on many many occasions and his passion for the game and likeable personality is a fantastic example to his team mates.

Just recently on Dec 1st Watergrasshill United U16's created club history with a tremendous win in the National Area Cup final win over Leeside. Both teams finished 2-2 after the allotted 80 minutes. Extra time went on with very little between two evenly matched sides. Finally in the very last minute with the dreaded penalty shoot out looking very likely Watergrasshill were awarded a free kick a good 35 yards out. Up stepped Dylan O'Donovan and with a great shot that deceived the keeper scored to win the game in the most dramatic of fashions. Hard luck to Leeside but Watergrasshill United are proudly into the last 32 of the National Cup and can now play any one of 31 other teams from Cork to Donegal home or away early in the new year. As Cork have only 5 National Cup representatives per age group and over 70 teams are eligible to compete for these places it can be seen it is a brilliant achievement for our U16s to get this far. It is a tribute to the players themselves, their coaches and the wider Watergrasshill United coaches and support staff all of whom give their time year in, year out on a purely voluntary basis.

WATERGRASSHILL UNITED U16 SEASON REVIEW 2012/13

Having won div 3 at U15 level last season (2011/12) we got promoted an extra division to Division 1 at U16 level for season 2012/13. This was partly out of choice and pragmatism as all our games are now on 10:30am on a Sunday morning and for the most part avoiding clashing with other codes. Playing every week at a high level has been a huge learning curve for both players and managers. The reality in division 1 is that you can play well in a lot of games and still lose. It is also a league where for the most part you get punished severely for mistakes or a poor 10 minutes during a match. In addition up to very recently we have been operating with a very small squad and also dealing with players competing at high levels in other codes on Saturdays. As such the league games have been very challenging but as we speak the team is in mid table and definitely not out of its depth when at or near full strength.

The huge positive news is of course what you lose in the swings you gain in the roundabout and this has to be true for out National Cup run. As most will be aware the team recently qualified in dramatic style for the last 32 of the NC and in early February will host Malahide United at home. We are aware this is a great achievement for the team and for the whole club. Definitely competing in div 1 has helped enormously to raise the teams standard and we would feel key to our cup success. Recently Edward 'Pips' O Connell joined the management team and his enthusiasm and ideas have also been hugely influential. GIRLS ACADEMY YEAR IN REVIEW

Sponsorship: Prior to the commencement of our season we acquired a complete set of new jerseys, sponsored by BEKO. We also had a Christmas Draw sponsored by Mediterranean Shipping Company Genève, 7 prizes in total. For our away league games we continue to supply bottles of water, health bars to all participants including oranges for home & away games that go down a treat....!

Training/Weekly Dues/Registration:

We brought training indoors to the Community Hall back in October when the evenings got short & the weather became bad to ensure that we keep our entire squad together, both the older girls who play in the Under 12 CWSSL & our younger members. This certainly has worked & is quiet evident in the numbers attending indoor training on a Thursday between 5-7pm.

Although indoor facilities greatly restricts what we can/cannot achieve from a training point of view, the comradeship between all girls is incredible, many of whom go to different schools, Watergrasshill/Glenville/Fermoy, and only meet up once a week. This will certainly stand to them as we process over the next 2 years in our under 12 league.

Thanks to all families for registering and for your diligence with girls paying the euro 2.00 weekly payments which go towards hall rental/various club outgoings/reinvested back into the Club.

League:

This was always going to be a tough year for our Academy Girls & indeed coaches as they entered for the first time a competitive league. We had no previous foundation with this squad & the only option was an under 12 league, which means we compete against teams who have been established many years ago & who are 11, 12 year olds versus 8,9 years old from Watergrasshill United. This is a massive age difference, especially in sport, HOWEVER it seems to be us coaches who get deflated at the hands of results & not the girls!!! This goes back to the friendship bond within the squad. We are learning our trade the hard way & no doubt this will stand to them, the vast majority who are under 12 for the next 2/3 years!

We have been going through a run of away games, but for every away game there will be a home tie, with the exception of cup events. Our numbers travelling remain consistently great so thanks again and payments for the referee at home games only, has been 100 percent. Once this season is finished the CWSSL will place us in a league that is more compatible with other teams of similar ability.

Player of the league games/team captains:

For every league game we pick a team captain & player of the game, which empowers players & has improved their confidences.

Indoor Futsal Blitzes:

Again to ensure we continue to grow as a squad, we commit to entering the futsol blitzes run by our league, CWSSL, out in the Sports Village on the Model Farm Road. Going forward & to ensure that players don't get too fatigued on the night, we will be limiting our teams to 6 a side, bringing on substitutions at half time. Our attendance this year at these events have been astonishing, up to 18 at one blitz







CWSSL Training Sessions: To date 8 girls have attended a special indoor training session run by the CWSSL (one in Nov & one in Dec). Attendees were randomly picked & our members get a chance to interact with other team players under the eye of qualified coaches, all to improve their techniques.

Girls Under 12 Development Squad: As we play in an under 12 league at present, despite the young ages of our squad, the majority are actually 8/9/10 born 2002/2003/2004, we have two members who participate weekly at this sessions which is run by the CWSSL. This development squad is predominately targeted towards girls born in 2001 and therefore is the reason why we have not advertised our involvement this season as they will have the next 2/3 to participate. We will be looking at this more closely next season when we've a competitive one league run under our belts.



The boys coped brilliantly with the step up in class and won all of their games bar one, a home loss to Strand United. There were some memorable results during this phase, notably, recovering from being 3:1 down away to Mallow and coming back to winning 4:3 on a wet and windy evening. Other great results, were a last minute goal to beat Avondale away (Superb header by Tim Hegarty)and in the best performance I have seen from this side, a 4:3 win away to a very good Leeds team. These results mean we won that non-competitive league on points and were then placed in Division 2 for the start of our journey in competitive league games with full sized pitches, goals and official CSL appointed referees.

The challenge for this squad for 2013 is to up their performances in their remaining matches of the 2012/2013 season and to therefore consolidate their standing in Division 2. We can continue to build from there and if we all stick together there is going to be lots to enjoy for the future.
